

PASTOR'S COLUMN:

The Feast of St. Vincent de Paul—A Time to Reflect and Renew Our Commitment to Charity

Dear Faithful of St. Ignatius Parish,

As we draw near to the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul on September 27th, it is both a privilege and a duty to delve into

the remarkable work of the Society named in his honor—a work that I have been intimately involved with as the Spiritual Advisor for the Holy Name Conference for the past five years. I am so pleased and encouraged to see the good work of our own conference here at St. Ignatius.

The Universal Mission of the St. Vincent de Paul Society
Founded in 1833 in Paris, the Society of St. Vincent de Paul is
an international Catholic organization dedicated to the
sanctification of its members through works of charity. The
Society operates through Conferences, which ideally exist in
every Catholic parish to serve the needs of the poor within its
boundaries. The Society's work is rooted in the Gospel, and its
most fundamental activity is the Home Visit. Blessed Frederic
Ozanam, one of the Society's founders, eloquently stated,
"Knowledge of the poor and needy is not gained . . . but by
visiting the slums where they live."

The Unique Charism of Our Society at St. Ignatius

While the mission of the Society is universal, the St. Vincent de Paul Society at St. Ignatius of Loyola Parish has its unique characteristics. We are one of only 28 Conferences in the Archdiocese of Denver, and we extend our services to three neighboring parishes that lack a Conference. This year, we are on pace to increase our expenditures and the number of people served by about 40 percent over the last year—a testament to the growing needs and our commitment to meet them.

The Multifaceted Ways We Serve

Home Visits: In line with the Society's foundational practice, our volunteers conduct home visits, offering both material and spiritual aid.

Hotline Team: A dedicated team manages our assistance line, ensuring that help reaches those who need it most.

<u>Food Pantry</u>: Our food pantry, run from a garage at the rectory, provides essential food items to those in need.

<u>Loyola Garden</u>: This initiative provides fresh produce for our food pantry, embodying a holistic approach to charity.

A Call to Action

The Society meets every third Sunday of the month, and have various volunteer opportunities available. On the evening of September 23rd, at the end of the Mass, we will be commissioning new members. I want to personally encourage everyone who has been involved in different ways in this great work, and warmly invite you to consider this vocation within our parish community if you have not already.

As we celebrate the Feast of St. Vincent de Paul, let us heed the words of Blessed Rosalie Rendu: "Be kind and love, for love is your first gift to the poor." May this feast serve as a catalyst for renewed commitment to the Society's noble mission.

INTRODUCING OUR MONTHLY HISTORY HOUR
