PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners of St. Ignatius,

As we gather for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we find ourselves at a significant moment filled with rich opportunities for our spiritual growth and community outreach. We are in a Year of Eucharistic Renewal—a special time to deepen our understanding and love for the Holy Eucharist, the "source and summit of the Christian life," as declared by the Second Vatican Council. Theology gives us an accurate perspective not only on Divine Revelation and how to understand it, but also on how we are to live out our lives, conforming them to the truth of God.

Earlier this week, we celebrated the Feast of St. Luke. His account of the disciples on the road to Emmaus serves as a poignant reminder of the transformative power of the Eucharistic encounter. The disciples began with a sadness and disappointment that prevented them from making an act of hope. It was Jesus Himself who appeared to them and caused their hearts to burn as he explained the scriptures to them. The disciples then recognized that this stranger was actually Jesus in the breaking of the bread. We are also called to recognize Him, not only on the altar but also in the faces of our neighbors. And we must understand that our neighbors can begin to experience the flame of the presence of God when they encounter us.

This idea of recognizing Christ in others is central to the neighborhood outreach efforts we began this week. Our community is comprised of individuals who, like the disciples on the road to Emmaus, are in various stages of their spiritual journeys. Our calling is to bring them the Person of Christ, thereby embodying the transformative power of the Eucharist in our everyday actions.

I am excited to announce that we have a concrete opportunity to put this vision into practice: our Fall Festival on the 28th of this month. This is not just a time for games and fellowship but an occasion to invite the people who live right next door to our church to the communal life that reflects the love and unity to which the Eucharist calls us. May we fan the flame of their hearts into an eager desire to receive our Lord in the Eucharist.

To make our outreach truly Eucharistic, our invitation to our neighbors is not only for the festival but also for the celebration of the Mass—the fullest expression of our Christian life and community.

So let us heed the words of St. Luke: "Were not our hearts burning within us while he talked with us on the road and opened the Scriptures to us?" May this inner conviction move us to action, inspiring us to bring the transformative power of the Eucharistic Christ into our neighborhood, starting with our Fall Festival and continuing into our ongoing outreach efforts.

Let us ask for the intercession of St. Luke and seek the blessings of the Eucharistic Christ on all that we undertake.


