PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Parishioners,

As we arrive at the Second Sunday of Advent, our journey continues through the fearsome reminders of Christ's triumphant return and the final judgment of our souls, and our hearts yearn more earnestly for the tender celebration of Christ's birth. The preparation by tears, be they yet hidden

and inward, cleanses the soul, preparing it to receive the truth and the themes that call us to a deeper spiritual reflection.

John the Baptist – A Call to Humility and Transformation: This Sunday, we are reminded of the pivotal role of John the Baptist in preparing the way for Jesus. John, a figure of humility and asceticism, invites us to a transformative repentance – a "metanoia," or complete change of mind and heart. His life, characterized by simplicity and dedication, is a stark contrast to our modern preoccupations. In the spirit of John the Baptist, let us prepare our hearts for Christ's coming, not with a sense of self-punishment, but with a transformative openness to God's love and mercy. Let us acknowledge the spiritual value in denying ourselves unnecessary comforts and pleasures.

Our Lady of Loreto – The feast of Our Lady of Loreto (December 10th) commemorates the Holy House of Loreto, believed to be the very home where the Virgin Mary received the Annunciation. This sacred house, miraculously transported by angels, symbolizes not just a physical dwelling but also the spiritual shelter that Mary provides for all who seek her intercession. In honoring Our Lady of Loreto, we acknowledge Mary as the sanctuary of the Word Incarnate, and we are reminded of the importance of creating a holy dwelling within our own hearts for Jesus. As we celebrate this feast, let us seek to emulate Mary's openness to God's will and her role as the first and most perfect disciple of Christ.

In the midst of Advent, this feast day draws our attention to Mary's integral role in the story of salvation. Her unwavering 'yes' to God mirrors the humility and readiness we are called to emulate. As we honor Our Lady of Loreto, let us draw inspiration from her faith and trust in God's plan. This feast encourages us to deepen our awareness of our spiritual childhood and rekindle our devotion to our mother Mary, who brings us closer to Christ.

Isaiah's Message of Comfort and Hope: The words of Isaiah resonate with a message of comfort and hope, anticipating the coming of Christ. "Comfort, comfort my people, says your God" (Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11). As we reflect on this prophecy, we are encouraged by the power of God's Word - we have not been created only to be annihilated: our Father takes no pleasure in our suffering, He permits it for our spiritual healing. This Advent, let us open our hearts to the hope and consolation brought by Christ, allowing His light to dispel the darkness in our lives.

In this season of anticipation and reflection, let us embrace humility, seek transformative repentance, and draw nearer to God through our Marian devotion. May our preparation for Christmas be a time of spiritual renewal, leading us towards the joyous celebration of the Nativity of our Lord.
