

Pastor's Column

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather for the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time, our hearts are still aglow with the joy and grace of the Christmas Season. Now, we journey into a period that is an opportunity for spiritual growth, a time that serves as a bridge between the birth of Christ and His sacrificial journey during Lent. St. Ignatius of Loyola, a figure deeply rooted in traditional Catholic spirituality, offers us a path to deeper communion with God through the discernment of spirits. His teachings provide a framework for understanding our inner experiences and aligning our responses to them with God's will.

The Rules for the Discernment of Spirits, as laid out by St. Ignatius, are particularly relevant in our time. They teach us to recognize the movements of our soul, to differentiate between consolations that draw us closer to God and desolations that pull us away. In a world where we are constantly bombarded with conflicting messages and ideologies, these rules offer a sure path of clarity and truth.

I strongly encourage each of you to participate in this series. Learning and applying the principles of Ignatian spirituality can be a transformative experience, fostering a deeper, more intimate relationship with God. It is a journey towards understanding His will for us, leading to greater peace and holiness.

As we navigate this Ordinary Time, let us embrace the opportunity for spiritual growth. Let us take the time to reflect on the readings, to discern God's presence in our lives, and to prepare our hearts for the journey to Lent. May this time be a period of fruitful growth, guided by the teachings of the Church and the wisdom of saints like Ignatius of Loyola.


Upcoming Second Collection
