Pastor's Column

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we reach the Fourth Sunday of Lent—traditionally known as "Laetare Sunday" from the Latin word meaning "rejoice"—we pause to glimpse the Easter light that approaches. The rose vestments that replace our Lenten purple today speak to what St. Augustine called a "consoling breath" amid our penitential journey reminding us that Lent is half over, and Easter is enticingly near. Like travelers who have climbed halfway up a mountain and turn to see how far we've come, we stand today in a moment of hopeful anticipation. In today's Gospel, we encounter the man born blind, whose story forms the heart of the Second Scrutiny for our catechumens preparing for Easter baptism. Christ declares, "I am the light of the world," then proceeds to illuminate eyes that had never before seen light.

This powerful image reminds us that our Lenten journey is one from darkness to light, from blindness to sight. The early Christian writer Origen tells us that Christ "illuminates the deep things of darkness" within us, not merely granting physical sight but spiritual vision—the ability to see ourselves, others, and creation through God's eyes.

The scrutiny rites, which our elect undergo today, are ancient practices of spiritual preparation. They are meant to "uncover, and then heal, all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts" of those preparing for baptism, while strengthening "all that is upright, strong, and good." Like the blind man in the Gospel who moves from darkness to proclaiming Christ before others, our catechumens journey toward the illumination of Easter. As they do, we who were baptized years ago are invited to renew our own commitment to living as children of light.

The prophet Isaiah reminds us today: "The Lord will guide you always; he will satisfy your needs in a sun-scorched land and will strengthen your frame. You will be like a well-watered garden, like a spring whose waters never fail" (Isaiah 58:11). Even amid our Lenten disciplines, God's grace sustains and renews us. The rose color we see today symbolizes this joy breaking through our penitence—like the first light of dawn coloring the eastern sky while night still lingers.

I invite you to experience another form of spiritual illumination at our special concert this Saturday, April 5th at St. Ignatius Loyola Catholic Church. "Echoes in Time" will feature the Denver Brass joining forces with St. Martin's **Chamber Choir** in a unique collaboration that combines "the soulfulness of voice with the raw power of brass" in a program of sacred and classical works. St. Martin's Chamber Choir has delighted Colorado audiences for more than 30 years with "its exhilarating sound, its exquisite blend, and its fascinating repertoire, drawn from 1,000 years of choral music." This concert offers a beautiful meditation as we journey through Lent, with the historic stone walls of our church resonating with timeless sacred music. The performance begins at 7:30 PM in the main sanctuary. While tickets are available for purchase, parishioners are welcome to attend without purchasing tickets and may make a freewill donation if able.

In these final weeks before Holy Week, may we continue to prepare our hearts through prayer, fasting, and works of mercy. Like the man born blind, let us allow Christ to touch our eyes that we might see anew—recognizing His presence in Scripture, in the sacraments, and in one another. Let us rejoice, for the light of Easter draws near!


